

Idioms- Phrase or expression whose meaning isn't understood from the ordinary meanings of the words in it.

Example:

GOOD EGG = A PERSON YOUR FOND OF, A KIND PERSON.

IT'S RAINING CATS AND DOGS= IT'S RAINING UNBELIEVEABLY HARD
